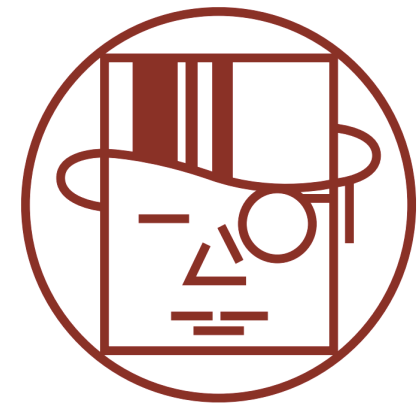

The Wellington Exempted Village School District (WEVSD) is proud to serve the students residing in the historic village of Wellington and the surrounding townships. We provide quality PreK-12 education through Westwood Elementary (PreK-3), McCormick Middle School (4-8), and Wellington High School (9-12). WEVSD partners with the Lorain County JVS for career and technical education, the Pathways to Success program for alternative pathways to graduation, and the LCCC Wellington Center for higher education opportunities.

Student Life

Students in the Wellington Exempted School District benefit from a small school experience rich in programming developed to foster the whole child. Our special programs help students reach their high academic, athletic and individual potential through their school experience, including:



- **A personalized education for every student**, including a continuum of services for students with disabilities, those who have been identified as gifted, or have different learning styles
- **A low 16:1 student to teacher ratio**, with 100% of core academic subjects and elementary classes taught by Highly Qualified teachers
- **Abundant creative programming** to develop individual talents through the fine arts, theater, choir, band and orchestra
- **A strong athletics program**, including football, basketball, baseball, soccer, cross country, golf, bowling, cheerleading, volleyball, softball, track and wrestling
- **FFA, formerly Future Farmers of America**, to support career development in agriculture
- **College credit options**, saving families thousands of dollars off college tuition
- **A Community Service Graduation Requirement** to support the overall development of a well-rounded adult through giving back to the community
- **Career and Technical Education** certifications earned in partnership with the Lorain County JVS and Lorain County Community College
- **Free, all-day Kindergarten**

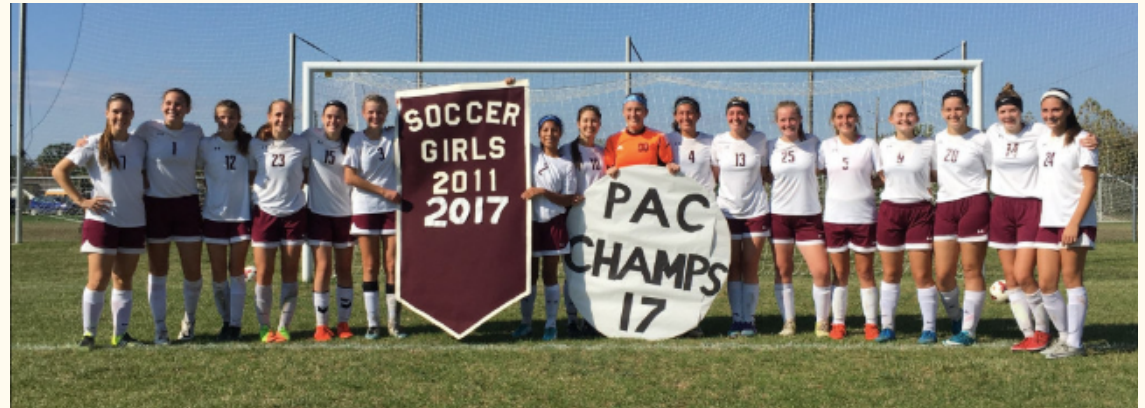

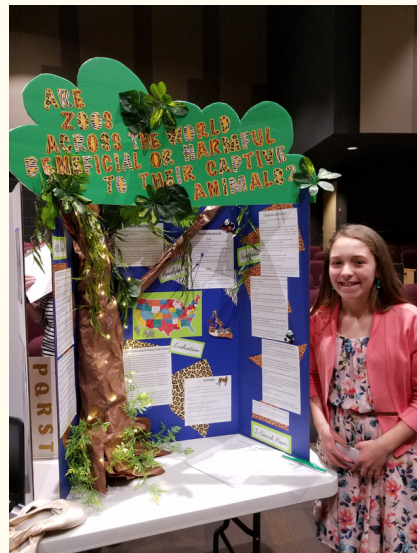

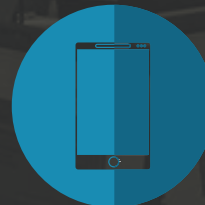
