Thank you for your continued support. Happy Holidays!


# **REMOTE LEARNING**

### SPORTS BACK ON

After meeting with Lorain County Public Health, the Lorain County League Superintendents, Principals, and Athletic Directors agreed to resume athletic competition. This restart includes all Winter sports. The boys and girls basketball schedules have been modified to play league opponents only. All other schedules will remain the same moving forward. #### Additional League Mandates:

- Two passes per athlete. All spectators must have a pass (infants will be admitted).
- The gymnasium will be cleared at the conclusion for the JV games.
- No food or drink in any LC8 gymnasium.
- Cheerleaders will not travel to away games, and will wear masks during games.
- Masks must be worn at all times fully covering the mouth and nose.
- Families are expected to sit in family pods while socially distancing from other spectators.
- No congregating before, during, or after an event.
- Varsity parents should arrive no more than 15 minutes prior to scheduled tipoff time.


We have seen the ramifications of COVID-19. It is imperative we follow these guidelines so that our athletes can continue to play.

### **ROX PROGRAM BUILDS SELF-ESTEEM**

Wellington High School Principal Tina Drake recently presented to the Board of Education her plans to begin investing the next 20 weeks in a new program designed to build confidence, self-image, leadership skills, and career goals in girls.

Drake outlined the program called Ruling Our Experiences, or ROX. She completed training as a ROX instructor.

"Girls are struggling with a number of issues unique to being a girl," Drake told the Wellington Board of Education during the meeting.

She said girls are at a higher risk for anxiety, depression, sexual harassment and sexual violence. Females are also underrepresented in leadership roles and in science, technology, engineering and math careers.

ROX is "a plan for girls to be supported by other girls, to be strong and bold, to make decisions" and explore important changes in their lives, she said.

ROX is a nonprofit committed to equipping all girls with the skills they need to navigate these challenges. At Wellington High School, the pilot program has been set up for a select group of juniors and seniors recommended by staff. The goal is to train more staff as ROX leaders and expand the program into lower grades.

Drake said she wants to give every one of her female students the opportunity to take part before graduating.
