

Staff H.E.A.R.T. Awards

Staff Awards Heart to H.E.A.R.T.

A new set of staff members won the Communicate with H.E.A.R.T. awards for the stellar customer experience they demonstrated to a fellow colleague or, in this case, a parent. A troupe of noisemakers that included Superintendent Ed Weber, board President Ayers Ratliff, board member Patti Shellhouse, Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent Lindsay Bowman and H.E.A.R.T. trainer Ron Kisner.

The group disrupted kindergarten teacher Jill Stone's classroom of giddy students to present her award. Tech guru Jon Heyd received his honor in McCormick's hallway. Third grade teacher Cristy Hess was feted before a crowd of students and parents at the end of a spelling bee in the Lindley Center. Lindsay Bowman was caught off guard with her surprise award before the revelers left McCormick.

H.E.A.R.T. (Hear, Empathize, Apologize, Respond, Thank) selections for the service awards are generated from comments made on a survey on the school's website by staff members, parents or community members who engage with district employees. The following are snippets of comments made about each of the first 2023-2024 School Year recipients:

A parent shared that "Mrs. Stone has been so understanding of our child's stress in starting kindergarten. We are so happy to have Mrs. Stone this year." A coworker wrote of Miss Hess "we work together daily and are able to team to complete our tasks. She always greets me warmly." A colleague of Mr. Heyd's shared that he "is always helpful with anything and everything technical and he does it with a smile."

Ron Kisner echoed similar survey commentary about Mrs. Bowman. "Mrs. Bowman, you are the embodiment of communicating with H.E.A.R.T. whether the engagement is on the phone or in person, you are consistent with genuine, warm smile, and a caring demeanor."

Winners receive a paper certificate, a red balloon, and a \$25 gift card to Bread-N-Brew. Plans are to present the quartet before the Board of Education at a mid-March meeting, and to make additional awards in the spring.


