Most recently, Andrea served as the Clinical Nutrition


Manager at University Hospitals Samaritan Medical Center.

WHS band heading to State Competition Nov. 6 in Medina







- Best piece of advice someone gave you? "Control the things you can control, worrying is a waste of time."



Students create positive messages




Walking through McCormick Middle School one can't help but notice the dozens of posters that line the walls throughout the school.


