### **Sensory Room at McCormick**

Congratulations! McCormick Middle School intervention specialist Madison Virgin's MH classroom desperately needed a sensory space for students with special needs. She recently applied for a Wellington Schools Endowment grant and we are happy to report, the grant was approved! A sensory room is a safe space with a variety of equipment that provides students with special needs with personalized sensory input-helps students calm and focus themselves so they can be better prepared for learning and interacting with others. Thanks to the Endowment Grant, we will be able to create a safe space for our students at McCormick Middle School.

### **EGG-citing Life-Cycle Lesson**

An exciting lesson learning about life-cycles!
Chicken Quest is a statewide, 4-H School Enrichment program.
McCormick Middle School Intervention Specialist, Madison Virgin worked with Sally Hennessy from OSU Extension STEM programming outreach for all of Lorain County. They provided all of the supplies and materials needed for the lesson this past spring, such as the incubator, chicken eggs, measuring equipment, student workbooks, teacher manual, and much more!

All of the content is aligned with the Ohio State Standards. The chicken eggs came from Meyer Hatchery in Polk, Ohio. There are so many great things with this program. The students had so much excitement and priceless expressions when the chickens hatched. Many of the students had never experienced the lifecycle first-hand. The most exciting part is when the the class got to explore candling, holding the baby chickens, and showing the students what new life is all about.







### SOLAR SPRINT CAR COMPETITION

Mapleton Local Schools recently served as the host site of the Fourth Annual Rural STEM Collaborative's Army Education Outreach Program Junior Solar Sprint Car Competition. Twenty-eight teams of students in grades 5 through 8 from the Rural STEM Collaborative school districts of Mapleton, New London, Northwestern, and Wellington raced against each other to see whose solar car ran the fastest using only solar power.

All student teams worked together to build a solar car using a required kit and customizing the design within the competition guidelines. The Rural STEM Collaborative provided students with the same conditions that they would experience during the national Technology Student Association AEOP Junior Solar Sprint competition.
